GOALS & OBJECTIVES SUMMARY STATEMENT

Books communicate ideas and come in a wide variety of styles and formats. Single workshops can be basic bookbinding structures like pamphlet binding or single sheet books. There are hundreds of simple structures that can be taught in one session. Bookbinding is a great integrated program for ELA programs.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Workshop participants will learn how to make a variety books starting with simple pamphlet bound books or single sheet books and moving on through more traditional hard cover structures or less traditional artist books.

For multiple sessions, participants can delve into more complex structures. Workshops with younger participants are geared towards collaboration and creating individual finished pieces while older participants are encouraged to creating more polished work and complex structures.

Great single session workshops: 8-page book, Turkish map fold, flexigon (similar to a magic wallet), pamphlet binding, and accordion books.

Multiple session workshop options: Coptic binding, hardcover binding, tunnel book, or Jacob's ladder.

VOCABULARY

Signature: a term used in bookbinding to describe a stack of nested, folded papers Bonefolder: a dull-edged hand tool used to fold and crease material Chapbook: a small printed booklet that was popular medium for street literature throughout early modern Europe. Chapbooks were usually produced cheaply, illustrated with crude woodcuts and printed on a single sheet
