PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Students will enjoy Buffalo's beautiful Delaware Park and experience the natural beauty, architectural landmarks, and captivating art in the park. This 90-minute walking tour begins at the Young Lincoln Statue and moves to the exterior of the AKG and around to the exterior of the Buffalo History Museum and through the Japanese Garden. We end after crossing the Three Tribes Bridge, the original entrance to the 1901 Pan Am Exposition. Your students will hear about the park's history, the exterior art installations at the AKG and in the park itself as well as the architectural significance of the Buffalo History Museum, Buff State, the bridges and the natural surroundings such as Hoyt Lake and Scajaquada Creek.
